Corvair sold at the Mecum Auction

For those of us that keep track of car auctions it is of interest that a 1966 Yenko Stinger was offered at Mecum's Kissimmee auction in January. It crossed the block on Friday, Jan. 11th, lot # F237. A pre-sale estimate of \$65,000 to \$100,000 was placed on the car. Identified as YS074, it was equipped with a stage III setup including 2 Weber 3 barrel downdraft carbs with a rating of 220 hp.

The hammer price was \$220,000 with the buyer's premium. This has to be considered both good news and bad news for the Corvair community. Nice to see our Corvair values increasing but also a bit worrisome how those car prices may impact our hobby.

The Yenko was not quite the price that the Fitch Phoenix commanded in the Greenwich CT Concours auction in June, 2014. The price for that car on that day was \$253,000. This beautiful car was a one off example built by John Fitch for possible production. The car was built with a 1966 Corvair drive train and chassis. Plans for production ceased when GM decided to end Corvair production.

63 Spyder Differential swap part 2 By Rick Beets

The early 4 speed transmission in my Spyder was on its' way out even after a refresh when I rebuilt the motor a couple years ago. I'd also been on the hunt for a 3:27 ring and pinion to give my car longer legs on the highway. I found a transmission that would work with the 64 differential currently installed. It also included a late model differential. When I took everything to Steve Goodman, we discovered that the late model differential contained a 3:27 ring gear driven by an early pinion. Steve then pointed out that I wouldn't be able to use it in my differential. Why not, I asked?

For starters Steve said, the early ring gear had a different bolt pattern from late. The late model case is also wider than an early, so you can't swap the internals over. Unless..

Unless, what I asked?

Modifications can be made to the late model carrier to make it fit into an early case.

Modifications? What kind of mods?

You can narrow the carrier halves to fit the early case by milling off some extra material the bearing surface. Hmm, I thought. I have a small mill and lathe in the basement, what could go wrong? I little more research showed it wasn't quite that simple, so here are the steps required to make late model differential components fit an early case.

Step 1: Machine about ½ inch off the end of each side of the differential carrier (where the spider gears live) that goes beyond where the bearings are pressed on. Since we've removed a bunch of material, we've lost most of the surface that supports the axel yokes. The solution is to make a sleeve that can be pressed into the carrier. (Right)



Step 2: We first need to bore out the ID the carrier halves to allow the insertion of a steel sleeve. What turned out to be the biggest hassle, was to get the part centered in my 4 jaw chuck! (Left)



Step 3: Turn down the OD of the sleeve material (I chose chromoly tubing with a .188 wall thickness) so it is just a little bit larger than the ID cut in the carrier halves to make a good press fit. (Right)



Step 4: Cut sleeves to length and press into the carrier halves. (Left)



Step 5: Bore the ID to get a nice fit to the axel yokes (about .002 over), and trim off any excess sleeve material. (Right)

How to identify a '66 versus a '65 – Part 2

Part two of five parts John Dawson

Changes to 1966 model year from 1965 model year *

BODY

- 1) New style tail light lenses (wedding band style on early 66s)
- 2) New style rear lower exhaust grill.
- 3) New style trim insert for redesigned lower exhaust grill for Corsa models
- 4) No pinstriping on beltline of Corsa model.
- 5) New style Monza cross
- 6) New plastic front “spoiler” lower valance
- 7) New style “wide” chrome lock trim piece with blue instead of red center.
- 8) Corvair script relocated from hood to front panel. (three instead of two prongs)
- 9) New style standard hubcaps with new design plastic inserts
- 10) New style one-piece wheel well trim
- 11) Different trunk lock cylinder
- 12) Restyled thinner “look” rocker trim
- 13) Front aluminum headlight bezels have a minor change. (added weep hole)
- 14) Remote mirror style changed to the “1967” style (03/02/66)
- 15) (most 66 models had the older style which moved the entire head when adjusting)
- 16) Headlight backing plate changed
- 17) Sheet metal box on air inlet shelf now gone.
- 18) New style rear hood emblems for 110hp emblem (new mounting holes on rear hood.
Fits newer 110hp emblem only)
- 19) New style rear hood emblems for 140hp emblem (new mounting holes on rear hood. Fits newer 140hp emblem only)
- 20) New style rear hood emblems for 180hp emblem (same mounting holes as all 1965 rear hood emblems)
- 21) New improved firewall mounting for steering column to improve safety
- 22) Less spot welds on body
- 23) New style outside rearview mirror (nonremote)
- 24) Trunk splatter paint color darker on 1966 Van Nuys built Corvairs
- 25) Gas tank strainer removed (according to GM parts catalog)
- 26) Attaching screws for tunnel pan changed. (01/04/66) '65 part # 9417881 '66 part # 9421479
- 27) Front hood spring retainer has 2 screws on 65's and only 1 on 66's
- 28) Steel floor plugs no longer have a notch on opposing sides like the 1965 models.
- 29) Lower heater hose straps mounting position changed
- 30) Speedometer cable routed differently. (07/09/65) The cable is routed under the brake line on 1965 models and over the brake line on 1966 models. (See assembly manual for details)
- 31) Front license plate mounting frame changed. 1965 models had only round holes to mount plate. This required a nut and bolt to install the plate. 1966 models have square holes for plastic inserts, which require only a bolt to screw into the insert.
- 32) Different routing of AC lines in body.
- 125) On 65's the bezel screwed into the backing plate and in 66 it screwed into extra brackets in the headlight buckets.

BRAKES

- 33) Front brake shoe anchor pin changed
- 34) Late 1966 models have predrilled holes for dual master cylinder.
