The 36th Annual Colorado Concours d'Elegance was held Sunday June 9th at Arapahoe Community College. It is a charity event for a program of the "Ability Connection Colorado" which provides services for creative options for early childhood development.

There were twelve and a half Corvairs in attendance along with a 300-400 hundred "other" vehicles. The "half" vehicle was SeeMore which was brought to the show by Rick Beets using Tony Lawler's tow vehicle and trailer (thanks Rick and Tony!). The Greenbrier van used by TAIT, the group dedicated to support children with autism (and their families) was there and drew a crowd.

There were thousands of people in attendance who came to see our Corvairs and the "other" vehicles. Ed Halpin arranged with the sponsors to have our vehicles parked in a nice, grassy, strategic (portapotties were close but not too close) area near the group of food vendors. 
